Let us begin by getting access to the scratch platform. There are two ways to get access to scratch — online and offline. You can choose the one that is more convenient for you.

For using Scratch online, open a new tab on your browser and visit scratch.mit.edu. Click on 'Start Creating' and get going.

You can also use Scratch offline by downloading its offline version from scratch.mit.edu/download and installing it in your system. Choose you operating system to download the right application for your computer or laptop. After the file has downloaded, click on it to install Scratch. Press the Finish button to complete the installation and you can now get started with Scratch.
